

WELCOME, NEWCOMERS

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks and shorts are not permitted, nor is sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing.

Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie. (High temps – suit coat optional) Jeans & other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.

Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have met with Father.

OCTOBER MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY...

The Feast of the Holy Rosary is a manifestation of gratitude for the great victories won by the Christian people through the power of Mary; it is also the most beautiful and authoritative testimony of the value of this prayer.

The Hail Mary, continuously repeated, should express the attitude of a soul who is striving to approach the Blessed Virgin, hastening toward her in order to be captivated by her and given insight into the divine mysteries; thus the necessity of meditating on the various Mysteries of the Rosary.

“Ave Maria!” the lips say, and heart murmurs : “Teach me, O Mary, to know and love Jesus as thou knew and loved Him.” Saying the Rosary in this way requires recollection.

St. Teresa of Jesus says that “before beginning to recite the Rosary, let the soul think of whom it is going to address, and who it is that is speaking, that it may speak to Him with due respect” (cf. Way, 22).

The Saint, with her keen wit, laughs at those people “who are so fond of repeating a large number of vocal prayers in a great hurry, as though they were anxious to finish their task of repeating them daily” (ibid., 31).

Rosaries recited in this way, cannot really nourish our interior life; they will bring little fruit to the soul and little glory to Mary.

On the other hand, if recited with a real spirit of devotion, the Rosary becomes an effective means of cultivating devotion to Mary and of bringing us into intimacy with Our Lady and her Divine Son.

AND HOLY ANGELS

Our knowledge of the angels is very imperfect. Here on earth, we can only distinguish them in a general way. In heaven, we will know them distinctly. We will see their relation to God and how they have acted to bring about God’s loving plan. Based on Scripture, Sacred Tradition and Sacred Theology distinguish nine choirs of angels. These nine choirs, organized in three sets of three, are a reflection of the Trinity: the first three choirs are closest to God and contemplate him and the goal of his creation: Seraphim, Cherubim, and Thrones; the next three choirs consider what is to be done to reach this goal: Dominations, Virtues, and Powers; the last three choirs apply this knowledge to God’s effects: Principalities, Archangels, and Angels.

It is generally agreed that all Christian communities, countries, families, dioceses, churches, and religious houses have each their Guardian Angel, and St. Francis de Sales wrote that Bishops have another
